VILLAGE OF FAIRFAX POLICE DEPARTMENT HOLIDAY SAFETY INFORMATION

This upcoming holiday season, we ask that all residents as well as employees working in our community be aware of the **increased potential for auto thefts**. Some facts about theft from autos:

Auto thefts account of 41% of all thefts in the region.

The most commonly stolen property is a GPS.

The majority of auto thefts occur on holidays such as Christmas

The hours between 7PM and 6AM account for the majority of vehicular burglaries

A theft from an auto can take less than 7 seconds.

Halt Auto Break-Ins Today....Get in the HABIT of doing the following:

ALWAYS lock your doors and roll up windows

Try to park in well-lighted areas

DO NOT leave anything valuable inside your car

Take items with you or lock them in your trunk

HOLIDAY EMAIL ALERT

Each holiday season brings an increase in the number of fake/spam emails that have the express purpose of identity theft, monetary theft, and corporate information theft. These emails masquerade as shipping notices, order forms, credit or gift card notices, shopping deals, and free gifts. You may even see an email pretending to be your bank or the IRS.

DO NOT click on any links in odd, unexpected, and unsolicited emails that request you take some kind of action.

DO NOT click on any links that are asking you for corporate or personal credentials, personal or financial information.

PLEASE REMEMBER, you should **NEVER** be asked **VIA EMAIL** for your login credentials and/or password for any reason.

If you think you may have fallen victim to identity theft attempt, or if you see subsequent related pop ups demanding further personal interaction asking for money to regain access to date, contact the police department at 513-271-7250.





"Reminder Tax Season Will Soon Be Here"

2013 Village of Fairfax Tax Returns are due April 15, 2014

All residents 18 years of age or older must file a tax return with the Village of Fairfax. This includes those who rent. Late filing charge applies even if no tax is due.

Tax Returns are mailed in January and are on our website or available in the lobby of our Municipal Building, www.fairfaxohio.org Lobby is open Mon. - Fri., 9:00 am to 4:30 pm. Not receiving a form does not excuse anyone from filing a Tax Return.

Taxes are based on an individual's earned income. You must submit W-2's, 1099Misc. forms, Schedule E, Schedule C, and other income statements (interest, dividends and retirement income are NOT taxed by Fairfax). More details on how to calculate the tax due and fill out your Return will be in the January Forum.

If you file a federal extension, you must also file an extension with the Village of Fairfax. Any tax estimated to be due for 2013 must be paid with your extension to avoid penalty and/or interest charges. Remember extensions are only for filing your return.

Any questions about your 2013 Fairfax Tax Return call the Tax Office 527-6506.

HOURS: 8:30AM to 5:00PM, Mon. - Fri. (lunch 12 - 1:30) Evenings by appointment.

"NEW RESIDENTS" and THOSE WHO MOVED SINCE FILING THEIR TAX RETURN MUST REGISTER. Please call the Tax Office at 527-6506 promptly.

Tax Tips: 1) File early to avoid late filing fees.

- 2) Make an estimated tax payment now and again in January to avoid owing a large amount on April 15. (Estimated tax is based on the prior year's tax. Call the Tax Office if you need help calculating your estimated tax.)
- 3) Husband and wife can always file a joint return for Fairfax regardless of how they file their State or Federal Return.
- 4) Check your pay stub for local tax paid. You should only pay local tax to the place where you work or live. (Errors, contact the company's payroll dept.)

This is a quick overview of Village of Fairfax Earnings Tax Requirements. Not all regulations/policies can be covered here. Additional instructions are on our website.



Police Department and Fire District Launch Caring for Our Community Program

Several months ago, Fairfax police officer Lee Day started the Looking Out for Our Seniors Program in the Village of Fairfax. Several Fairfax residents have taken advantage of this program that allows for our elderly, homebound and disabled to receive periodic checks from our police department personnel to make sure they are doing OK. Since then, discussions have ensued with the Little Miami Joint Fire District. Firefighter Mike Thompson was interested in launching a similar program for the District's member communities of Fairfax, Columbia Township and Newtown.

It is with great excitement, that a shared program between the police and Fire District will be renamed the Caring For Our Community Program. With the increased aging population and for those residents with disabilities, there seems to be a gap in assistance addressing basic safety needs to many. This collaborative effort will provide those residents home safety/security evaluations, medication reconciliation, coordination with other social services and period checks on their well-being.

This program is available to any citizen in need who resides in our community. 
