#### Nominees for Doc Kusel Athletic Hall of Fame Being Accepted

The Mariemont High School Athletic Department is now accepting nominations for the Doc Kusel Athletic Hall of Fame. Former Mariemont High School athletes, coaches and school administrators are considered for induction, as well as individuals with a long record of service to the athletic department. Former student athletes that are considered for nomination must have a minimum of five years elapse from their graduation from high school.

The Doc Kusel Athletic Hall of Fame is named after long-time athletic director and coach of Mariemont High School. Started in 1971, the names of the annual Hall of Fame class are displayed on the Kusel Stadium concourse, and the inductees' pictures and accomplishments are displayed in the high school's Hall of Fame Walkway.

Once an individual is nominated for consideration, his or her name will remain on the ballot for subsequent years. The selection committee is comprised of former athletes, former and current coaches, and other representatives from the community.

Nominations should be sent to Athletic Director Tom Nerl at tnerl@mariemontschools.org or to his attention at Mariemont High School, 1 Warrior Way, Cincinnati, Ohio 45227. The nomination packet should include the Individual's name, year of graduation, current contact information, high school athletic and academic achievements, years of participation in athletics and the level of the sport played (varsity, junior varsity, freshmen), as well as verification of any and all league, all-city, all-district or all-state recognition. Verification can include copies or scans of yearbook articles, cdertificates, press releases or articles.

Deadline for submission for 2014 nominees is May 1, 2014, although nominations are accepted throughout the year. The Class of 2014 Induction Ceremony will take place before the varsity home opening football game against Batavia on Friday, September 5, 2014 at 6:30pm at Kusel Stadium.

# 2013 Village of Fairfax Tax Returns are due April 15, 2014

All residents 18 years of age or older must file a tax return with the Village of Fairfax. This includes those who rent. Late filing fees apply even if no tax is due.

Tax Returns were mailed in January, also are on our website <a href="www.fairfaxoh.org">www.fairfaxoh.org</a> and available in Municipal Building lobby. The lobby is open Mon. – Fri., 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. <a href="Not receiving a form does not excuse anyone from filing a Tax Return">Not receiving a form does not excuse anyone from filing a Tax Return.</a>

#### Taxes are based on an individual's earned income.

- 1) You must submit W-2's, 1099Misc. forms, Schedule E, Schedule C and other income statements (interest, dividends and retirement income are NOT taxed by Fairfax; also "unemployment compensation" is exempt for 2013). \*Use box 5 of W-2 when totaling your income.
- 2) Credit for tax paid to other "city" is allowed up to our rate of 1.75% (County tax is not a credit).
- 3) See reverse of form and website for more instructions, www.fairfaxoh.org.

Estimated Tax paid for 2013. Remember to "add" estimated tax paid after 1-8-14 to line 5b of your Return.

Any estimated tax that was paid after 1-8-14 would NOT be printed on the Return.

<u>If you file a Federal extension, you must also file an extension with the Village of Fairfax.</u> Remember "extensions are only for filing your return", any tax estimated to be due for 2013 must be paid with your extension to avoid penalty and/or interest charges.

This is an excerpt from the Villages' General Code.
Please be mindful of your neighbors - keep your animals contained.

#### 90.13 REGULATING THE KEEPING OF ANIMALS

Any person, firm or corporation who shall allow any animal habitually to remain and be lodged and be fed within his house, store, building or enclosure, shall be considered to be harboring the same. It shall be unlawful for the owner or harborer of any dog, cat or other animal to permit such dog, cat or other animal to run or fly at large in the Village of Fairfax so as to do damage to gardens, lawns, shrubbery or other private property or to cause injury to any person. Upon complaint of any person that his property has been damaged, or that he has suffered any personal injury by any dog, cat or other animal, the owner or harborer of such dog, cat or other animal shall, upon proof thereof, be deemed to have violated the provisions of this Section.

Whoever violates this section is guilty of a minor misdemeanor. If within one year of being found guilty of or pleading guilty to this section, the offender is guilty of this same section, the offender is guilty of a misdemeanor of the third degree.

#### The Neighborhood Watch


