Food offerings beginning at 5pm will feature hamburgers, hot dogs and Marco’s pizza, along with chips and fruit.



- Did you know....motor oil never wears out. Oil can be recycled, refined and used again and again.
- **Glass jars:** all colors
- **Metal Cans:** Aluminum, Steel cans and lids, empty aerosol can with the lids and tips removed
- **Plastic bottles:** bottle and jugs that have a small mouth and wider base, such as milk jugs, soda bottles, laundry detergent bottles, water bottles, shampoo bottles.
- **Paper:** newspaper, magazines, cardboard, mixed office paper and envelopes, paperboard, pizza boxes (free of food and debris), telephone books and catalogs.
- **Cartons:** food and beverage cartons such as milk, juice, soup, wine, and broth containers.
