Fairfax Residents Recycled 132 Tons in 2014

Congratulations Fairfax residents! In 2014, we recycled 132 tons of metal, glass, plastic and paper. Residents saved resources, conserved energy, and reduced pollution by recycling.

The recycling efforts in Fairfax:

Conserved enough energy to power every home in Fairfax for 8 days.

Reduced more air pollution than if every household in Fairfax rode their bicycle to work for 7 weeks.

Saved 1,104 trees from being harvested.

Recycling reduces pollution so the air we breathe is cleaner, conserves natural resources so we will have them to use in the future, and decreases the energy needed to make new products. Recycling also boosts our local economy by creating 169,000 jobs (4.3% of all jobs) just in the State of Ohio.

On average, each household in Fairfax recycled 342 pounds in 2014. That's 15.92% of all the waste we generate

TAX TIPS AND TOPICS

NEW THIS YEAR In an effort to return checks to tax payers more timely, the Tax Department is depositing checks prior to reviewing returns.

<u>Under this new procedure, you could receive a correction letter requesting additional information or tax due as late as June 30, 2015.</u>

USING TAX DOLLARS: The tax collected by the Village of Fairfax helps pay for police and fire protection, paramedic services, garbage collection, maintenance, recreation and all Village officials and employees who serve you.

Who must file a tax return with the Village of Fairfax? All residents 18 years of age or older. This includes those who rent. The 2014 Tax Return was due 4-15-15, late fees now apply.

<u>Taxes are based on an individual's earned income.</u> See reverse of tax form and website for instructions, www.fairfaxoh.org.

<u>If you file a Federal extension, you must also file an extension with the Village of Fairfax.</u> "Extensions are only for filing your return", any tax estimated to be due for 2014 must be paid with your extension to avoid penalty and/or interest charges.

"New residents" and those "who moved" since filing their last tax return must register. Please call the Tax Office at 527-6506 promptly. If you leave a message, spell your name and include your SS#, address, phone number and date you moved in.



Kiwanis Club Celebrates Historic Milestones

2015 marks a significant pair of milestones for the Kiwanis Club of Mariemont. While the Kiwanis International organization celebrated its 100th anniversary this past January, the local Kiwanis Club of Mariemont will embark on its golden anniversary this fall.

"Kiwanis International began its mission of serving the children of the world a century ago," said David Peterson, local club president, "and we're even more excited to continue our service to the surrounding communities, particularly the students of the Mariemont School District."

While the Kiwanis Club of Mariemont was chartered fifty years ago, the group's largest impact began near the turn of the century. "The club has a long history of service to the Mariemont area, but since the late 90s, we've hyper-focused on raising as much money as possible for student scholarships." With nearly \$200,000 raised since 1998, Kiwanis has impacted the lives of more than 60 local students, many of whom received scholarships beyond their freshman year.

"It's just great to have the opportunity to invest in the lives of our students," says Peterson, "but we couldn't do any of it without our great members and the area residents who support our fundraisers." Each year, the Kiwanis Club puts on three main events: a Spring Golf Outing in early May, the annual Art & Craft Fair the weekend after Labor Day, and their Holiday Nut Sale. And to celebrate their golden anniversary, the Kiwanis Club is building a float to highlight all of the community service groups in the area. "We know there are still a lot of people in the community that don't know what the Kiwanis Club does, but I'm pretty sure this will get their attention."

As for why the club has had so much success to date, Peterson credits the commitment of its members. "We just have a lot of hardworking, dedicated people willing to give their time and energy year after year to make these events as great as they are, and the schools are a tremendous partner in our success. Everyone just wants to make our community a better place to live and work and go to school, and I look forward to seeing what we can do over the next fifty years."

MHS Accepting Nominations for Kusel Hall of Fame

The Mariemont High School Athletic Department is accepting nominations for the "Doc" Kusel Athletic Hall of Fame. Named after a long-time athletic director and coach of Mariemont High School, the Athletic Hall of Fame had its initial class in 1971. The inductees of the annual classes of inductees have their names displayed on the Kusel Stadium concourse, and the inductee's pictures and accomplishments are displayed in the school's Hall of Fame Walkway.

Former athletes who are considered for nomination to the Hall of Fame must have a minimum of five years elapse since their graduation from Mariemont High School. Former athletes, coaches and school administrators are considered for induction, as well as individuals with a long record of service to the athletic department.

Nominations should be emailed to athletic director Tom Nerl at tnerl@mariemontschools.org or mailed to his attention at Mariemont High School, 1 Warrior Way, Cincinnati, Ohio 45227. Nomination information should include the the following about the individual:

full name, year of graduation, current contact information, high school athletic and academic achievements, years of participation in athletics, the level of the sport played (varsity, junior varsity, freshmen), verification of any all-league, all-city, all-district, or all-state recognition

Verification can also include copies of yearbook articles, certificates, press releases or articles. Once an individual is nominated for consideration, his or her name will remain on the ballot for subsequent years. The selection committee is comprised of former athletes, former and current coaches, and other representatives from the community.

For nominations to be considered for the 2015 induction class, the submission deadline is May 1, 2015, although nominations are accepted throughout the year. The Class of 2015 inductions will take place before the varsity home opening football game against Oakwood on Friday, August 28, 2015 at 6:30pm.
