

NOISE ORDINANCE REMINDER

The Village has received calls recently regarding barking dogs during late hours. Since the weather is now warmer, pets tend to stay outside for longer periods of time. Please make sure you are aware of the noise ordinance/regulations regarding your pets:

"No person being the owner of...an animal shall permit any such animal to create unreasonably loud and disturbing noise or sounds of such a character, intensity, or durations as to disturb the peace and quiet of...the Village off the premises where the animal or

fowl is kept. Evidence that the animal or fowl emits noise or sound which is heard between the hours of 11:00 PM and 7:00 AM off the premises on which it is kept...is a violation and subject to penalty"...per the Village of Fairfax General Code (Section 90.135 General Code)

Natural Gas Aggregation Program Announcement

The Village of Fairfax's Natural Gas Endorsement Program's flex down rate which is capped at \$0.444/ccf is due to expire soon. Your community leaders have been working with our consultant, Energy Alliances, Inc., to establish a new stable/protective rate for our residents. The new program will commence with June 2019 meter reads at the **great fixed price of \$0.396/ccf!**

Constellation NewEnergy – Gas Division LLC (Constellation) has again been chosen to supply the program. In the next week or two program participants will be receiving a rate notification letter in the mail from Constellation. After much research, we have chosen to take advantage of an unusual turn in market conditions that allows us to offer a 3-year fixed rate (June 2019 through May 2022). The reasoning for this change in strategy is that current market conditions indicate a long-term fixed price offers the most competitive pricing option available. This is directly opposite from past market conditions and is why this new strategy is being implemented.

We are pleased to continue to make this program available to residents. Eligible residents will receive this great fixed price and the quality customer service they have enjoyed in the past. By securing this competitive rate for our program we will continue to provide residents and small businesses price stability and protection for their natural gas costs.

As a reminder, our residents will never be approached by a door-to-door sales representative or telemarketer to participate in our aggregation program. All correspondence pertaining to our program will include our logo. SUMMER YARD AND PROPERTY MAINTENANCE INFORMATION

For those residents who may be new to the community – it is that time of year when we are busy with lots of yard maintenance. Please note that all grass clippings must be removed from the sidewalk and curb/street area. Please do not sweep or blow the clippings into the storm sewer or leave them to lay where they could be carried into the sewers. We strive to keep our sewers as clean as we can from debris such as grass clippings and leaves since we are a community prone to flash flooding. Your assistance in this effort is greatly appreciated. If you have a lawn service, please make sure they are aware of this as well. There is an ordinance requiring the proper removal of grass clippings and residents can be subject to fines for non-compliance.

Services Available to Residents: For anyone wanting to remove large amounts of brush from their yard, the Village can arrange to drop off a truck to your residence. You must pre-pay a fee of \$20 to the Clerk's office and contact Maintenance Supervisor Joe Huskey at jhuskey@fairfaxoh.org or 513-527-6508 to make arrangements. The resident can load up the truck with the brush and the Village will haul away and dump it for you. If any resident wants to purchase a large amount of mulch or trees to plant in their yard, the Village will pick up the items for you and drop off at your residence. There is no fee for this service as long as the items are prepaid by the resident at either Hafner & Sons, Evan's Landscaping, or Burger Farms.

<u>Sidewalk/apron replacement program:</u> If you are looking to have any sidewalk block or your apron redone, you may have found that many contractors are not available for very small jobs or that the cost for a few sidewalk blocks is cost-prohibitive. The Village is looking to bring in one contractor to handle a larger amount of sidewalk blocks if we get enough participation. If you are interested, please contact Joe Huskey at ihus-key@fairfaxoh.org or 513-527-6508 and provide your address and the number of sidewalk blocks you wish to have replaced.
