The Village of Fairfax has joined the Light Ohio Blue campaign to show and generate support for law enforcement personnel who protect our communities throughout our great state.

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation which designated May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. The Light Ohio Blue campaign coincides with activities associated to Police Week. This year's dates are Wednesday May 8 to Thursday May 16.

Residents in Fairfax are encouraged to show their support for law enforcement officers who have died in the line of duty and those currently serving, both sworn and civilian staff.

How can you help? The Fairfax Police Department will have blue lights available starting May $1^{\rm st}$. We ask that you replace your porch light with a blue light bulb during the week of May 8 to May 16. We will also have blue ribbon available. On Police Memorial Day – May 15, we encourage you to wear blue.

Today, scammers are more prevalent than ever and will say and do anything to steal your money. Recently, the number one way for a scammer to get to your money is by the use of gift cards. If someone calls you with urgent news or a convincing story and then pressures you to pay them by buying a gift card like iTunes, Google Play card, etc. and then giving them the codes off the back of the card – STOP!! – IT IS A SCAM!

Gift cards are the number one payment method that imposters demand. They may pose as an IRS official, Law Enforcement Officer, family member with an emergency, public works employee, or a service members asking for donations. Scammers may even call you with great news that you won a contest. These people know how to play into your fears, hopes and sympathies. They like to use gift cards because once they have the code on the back, the money is gone and it is almost impossible to trace. Knowing about these scams can help prevent them, so please share this information with your friends and loved ones. If you paid a scammer with gift cards, call the card company and let them know the cards were used in a scam.

PLEASE REMEMBER THAT GIFT CARDS ARE NEVER ASKED TO BE USED AS A LEGITIMATE FORM OF PAYMENT.

A Spotlight on The Dance Coalition

Monica Chaney and Allison McElfresh are the talented dynamic duo of <u>The Dance Coalition</u>. Although living parallel lives as dancers their paths did not cross until a chance meeting interviewing for the lead coach position of the Turpin High School Dance Team. "We clicked right away over our love for dance and our passion to give every dancer the chance he or she deserves. Together, we mentor many dancers, all deserving of the best dance experience available, which includes diverse techniques, healthy habits, and a nurturing growth environment," Chaney says.

It was not long before they realized dance was not the only thing they had in common: both had professional aspirations to open a dance studio and utilize space as a positive experience for dance families.

"We had opportunities in the works of owning our own studios but realized we would be able to serve the community better as a partnership and thus, the coalition was born. We saw the importance of this opportunity and that to let this pass us by would be to ignore fate," McElfresh says.

Partnership is a key component of The Dance Coalition and in this respect they complement each other. Their combined list of <u>credentials</u> and experience covers both the business and art of dance. "Monica brings the business of competitive endurance and I bring the breath of artistic freedom. Together we've united in order to lift up the community of dancers into their positive and ever-changing teenage lives," McElfresh says.

Chaney and McElfresh feel their combined skill are what sets their studio apart. "What is unique about The Dance Coalition is our method of integrating superior dance instruction with classroom academics in order to build brilliant dancers," explains Chaney.

The Dance Coalition will provide different programs: recreational, competitive, teacher/assistant training, adult group fitness/child watch, and the adult dance company "Unite". The recreational program will train 1 to 2 hours a week. The competitive program is geared toward those considering a career in dance and wanting to compete in an elite arena. The sustaining adult program welcomes 18+ that may have danced as children/ teenagers or are non dancers, but seek a desire to incorporate the art into their adult lives through Ballerobica, Shine Dance Fitness, Zumba, Uplift, adult Hip Hop, and Yoga Sculpt.

The Dance Coalition's education does not simply revolve around the physicality of dance it also involves the history, literature functionality and sustainability of the academic art. "One does not simply excel at ballet and become a prima ballerina at the New York City Ballet," Chaney says. "If a dancer is serious about ballet, they understand the history of the art and have a solid grasp of the physics, self-efficacy, and strength behind it then he or she increases their chances of landing that dream role."

The Dance Coalition's holistic approach requires a wide breath of knowledge for their students and this is reflected in the curriculum. "We encourage our dancers a "dream role" is they are their best number 1 and to learn as many genres as possible. Our ever-growing genres include: Classical ballet, musical theater, tap, jazz funk, hip hop, contemporary, lyrical and conditioning/acrobatics. Along with these classes students will engage how to seek knowledge by partaking in academic lessons, teacher/assistant training, day preschool camps, Reading Through Dance, and monthly social workshops. All focus on areas of essentials such as: Developing self -efficacy, cooperative learning, and social responsibilities through the Ohio Standards of Dance Education. "A true dream is using art to inspire these kids. Celebrating their interest into their own happiness, independence, and hugging their parents thanking them for putting them at the D.C., puts the tears back into our eyes. "McElfresh says.
