The maintenance department is continuing leaf pick-up from residents, but by mid-December all pick-ups will end for the year. Anyone that has leaves they wish to dispose of in late December must bag them for Rumpke to pick up. Please rake your leaves to the planter's strip and avoid placing in the gutter so that they do not get washed down the storm sewers.

As we head into the winter months, make sure to disconnect any outdoor hoses from the water spigots. Freezing water that is in the hose line can cause damage to your home.

As you remove the leaves from your yard, remember to check your gutters for clogged leaves one last time to prevent freezing water from damaging your gutters and downspouts.

We kindly ask that all residents please park in their driveways and keep as many cars off the streets as possible when snow is predicted. This makes snow removal more efficient and thorough and keeps your cars safe from the large trucks with snow plows coming down the streets. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated and will result in well-plowed and treated streets.
