To get registered on the system, please email Village Administrator at jkaminer@fairfaxoh.org and provide your name, address, any phone number(s) and an email at you would like to receive information. Both land lines and cell phone numbers may be included. You can also indicate whether you would like to receive only emergency notifications or non-emergency announcements as well.

Residents are also encouraged to sign up for weather and other emergency updates from the Hamilton County Emergency Management agency at www.alerthc.org Residents can register to receive county-wide emergency updates. 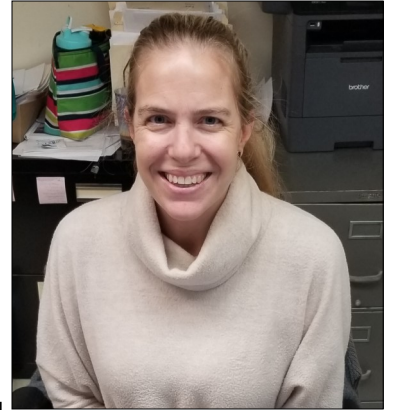

COVID 19 VACCINE INFORMATION

The Hamilton County Board of Health website provides current and helpful information regarding the COVID 19 vaccine. For those who are interested in the vaccine, you can register for when it becomes available for your particular age group. Please visit www.hamiltoncountyhealth.org/covid19/ This registry is to receive the vaccine through the Hamilton County Board of Health only.

More provider locations other than Hamilton County Board of Health are also listed on the site and clicking on the provider name will take you to more detailed information about each provider’s location and vaccine protocols.

The following information is the current vaccine roll-out schedule for the State of Ohio. If someone you know are in the following groups, please share this information with them and/or assist them with getting registered:

Effective the week of February 1, 2021, Ohioans 70 years and over are eligible to receive the vaccine as well as employees of K-12 schools who are choosing to work on-site. The week of February 8, 2021, the vaccine will be available to Ohioans aged 65 years and older. The vaccine is also currently available for those with qualifying medical conditions or developmental disabilities. The local board of developmental disabilities will reach out to individuals who qualify.

If you are a home bound senior citizen and need transportation, home52transportation.com get you to a location to receive the vaccine free of charge. Link and information can also be found at the website above.

WINTER REMINDERS FROM THE MAINTENANCE DEPARTMENT

We have been enjoying a fairly mild winter so far, but a snowstorm can come without any warning. Please make sure that you are not parking in any cul-de-sacs. It becomes very difficult for the snow plows to maneuver our already very tight streets. Also, there are several portable basketball hoops out because of the mild winter so far, but these become an impediment to a snow plow and should be removed for the season. When snow is predicted, please park your cars in a driveway, if at all possible.

For those who may not have remembered to remove their hoses from the hose bib outside their home, now would be a great time to do that before any potential snow or prolonged freezing weather arrives. This will save potential pipe breakage and water issues in your home.
