## **ZONING AND PERMITS**

The Village has received your permit in regards to property information is a summary of

\*ALL residential projects must be reviewed by Tony Perkins EXCEPT for the following:

\*For all other projects, a zoning permit is required by Tony Perkins. A copy of the zoning map is available on the website ([www.fairfaxoh.com](http://www.fairfaxoh.com)). Look for the "Zoning Application Forms" for the application. For fee information, showing the location must be provided. A street opening permit will be required for new driveways, drainage inlets, etc. The Village Engineer will be required to review all additions to a structure or driveway. All plans submitted to the Zoning Office must be accompanied by a fee.

\*All projects EXCEPT fencing and signs must be reviewed by the Hamilton County Building Department. Please review/approve your plans with the Building Department before submitting plans and application. ## “FREE” ITEMS ON THE CURB
