Mosquitos are Here! Mild winters and wet springs are great for your lawn. Unfortunately, these are perfect conditions for mosquitoes, as well.

Last year, there was a lot of news about the Zika virus, a mosquito-borne illness. You may recall that the mosquito primarily responsible for the spread of Zika is *Aedes aegypti*. This mosquito is found in the tropics and southern United States. It is not established in Ohio.

Aedes albopictus, the Asian tiger mosquito, may potentially transmit Zika virus in the United States, although it has not yet been implicated in any human cases. This mosquito has been identified in Hamilton County. That is why Hamilton County Public Health wants citizens to be on alert.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) very recently removed the travel advisory for South Florida.



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New Estimated Vax Forms

As a reminder 90% of the estimated taxes are due on December 15, 2017, if you owe over \$200.00. However, you can pay 100% of what you owed last year as the estimate amount for 2017. Doing so will cover you no matter how much you make in addition to what you made last year. This way you will not incur a late estimate penalty as long as it is paid by the due date of December 15,2017.

Now, you may say you cannot figure this out on your own, and if this is the case I made some forms that are just for you! There are two new forms to assist with figuring out your estimated taxes for the year at the bottom of our webpage http://fairfaxoh.com/residential-tax-forms/. These forms are also available upon request at the office. One is for use with a paystub, and one is for use by Postal Employees. Instructions are included with both forms, as well as examples. If you already have figured up your estimated taxes and need new forms to send in with your payments you can use the Quarterly Estimated Taxes For Use with Prior Year Returns form.

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PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE

Jim McCord, the new property maintenance officer for the Village of Fairfax has listed the most common property issues. Please review to make sure your property is in compliance to avoid citation.

- 302.1.1 Storage of Appliances and Furniture. Household appliances and furniture made for indoor use, including but not limited to upholstered furniture, shall not be kept, displayed, or stored in any exterior property area except within an enclosed appurtenant structure.
- 302.3 <u>Sidewalks and Driveways</u>. All sidewalks, walkways, stairs, driveways, parking spaces and similar areas shall be kept in good repair, and maintained free from hazardous conditions.
- 302.4 <u>Weeds</u>. All p[remises and exterior property areas shall be maintained free form plant growth in excess of 8 inches, including natural plant growth of non-nursery cultivated plantings, growth which is not in character with the surrounding properties, and, including weeds all grasses.
- 302.7 <u>Accessory Structures</u>. All accessory structures, including detached garages, fences and walls, shall be maintained structurally sound and in good repair.
- 302.8 <u>Motor vehicles and trailers</u>. No junk vehicle or junk trailer shall be parked, kept, or stored on any premises to which this Code applies, except that a vehicle or trailer of any type is permitted to undergo major overhaul, including body work, on such premises provided that such work is performed inside a structure or similarly enclosed area designed and approved for such purposes.
- 302.9 **Parking Motor Vehicles**. Motor vehicles may only be driven and parked on approved hard surfaces/ pavement of asphalt of concrete.
- 302.11 <u>Tree Trimming near Right-Of-Way</u>. Trees located on any lot or parcel fronting or adjacent to any sidewalk, street, or other public right-of-way shall be trimmed to have a clear height of ten feet above the surface of the sidewalk, and twelve feet above the surface of the street or other right-of-way.
- 302.13 Other Unsafe Trees. When a tree or any portion thereof presents an unsafe condition by constituting a danger or hazard to life, health, or property.
- 303.2 **Protective treatment**. All exterior surfaces of any structure, including but not limited to walls, doors, door and window frames, cornices, porches and trim, shall be maintained in good condition.
- 303.3 **Street Numbers**. Each structure to which a street number has been assigned shall have such number displayed in a position easily observed and readable from the public way. All numbers shall be in Arabic numerals at least 3 inches high and ½ inch stroke.
- 303.7 <u>Roof and Drainage</u>. The roof and flashing shall be sound tight and not have defects that admit rain. Roof drainage shall be adequate to prevent dampness or deterioration in the walls or interior portion of the structure. Roof drains, gutters and down spouts shall be maintained in good repair and free from obstructions. Roof water shall not be discharged in a manner that creates a public nuisance.
- 305.1 <u>Accumulation of Rubbish and Garbage</u>. All exterior property and premises, and premises, and the interior of every structure, shall be free from any accumulation of rubbish and garbage.
- 305.2 <u>Disposal of Rubbish</u>. Every occupant of a structure shall dispose of all rubbish in a clean and sanitary manner by placing such rubbish in approved containers.
- 305.3.2 <u>Containers</u>. The operator of every establishment producing garbage shall provide, and at all times cause to be utilized, approved containers provided with close fitting covers for storage of such materials until removed from the premises for disposal.
- 306.1 <u>Infestation</u>. All structures shall be free from insect and rodent infestation. All structures in which insects and rodents are found shall be promptly exterminated by approved processes that will not be injurious to human health. After extermination, proper precautions shall be taken to prevent re-infestation.
