

"April 18th has passed and I forgot to file my Village of Fairfax Tax Return."

Take a deep breath, accidents happen.

Stop into the Tax Department and file that return as soon as possible to prevent the Late Filing Penalty from getting bigger, it can get up to \$150 now, it is \$25 each month (even 1 day into that month) it is late. There is also other penalties and interest that may be added to your return. Bring your filled out Tax Return (more are available in the Municipal Building Lobby or on Fairfaxoh.org), any supporting Federal Forms (W2's, 1040's, Schedule C or E's) necessary and come see Ann to get it taken care of.

Don't worry there are three options to solve this dilemma.

Call Ann, I'm friendly, I promise and I can help. Let me know you need me to stay later so that you can make it into the office to get your tax return completed. I will work with you to get an appointment scheduled same day to get your taxes done and off your mind. Call Ann; have me help you fill in the tax return over the phone, then mail in or drop off your tax return, payment and documents to our Drop Box located on the back side of the building next to the grill and garbage cans. (Do NOT drop Cash in this box.) Drop off everything in our Drop Box and wait for Ann to send you correspondence back. Include an estimated payment with the documentation so that penalty and interest can stop accruing on the unpaid taxes. We can always put overpayments of the taxes owed towards your 2017 Taxes or refund it if it is above \$10.00.

"I received an Assessment. Is this new?"

The short answer is no, Assessments are not new. However when you receive one has changed, so more of these will be going out in the future years.

There are a few situations you will receive an Assessment for; one of these is if you did not make payment of 90% of your estimated tax for the 2016 tax year by 1/31/17. You will receive a certified letter and a regular mail letter with the same contents. You only need to sign one of the returns and send it back in with any payment due if necessary. There will be an additional insert with your Assessment letter that is the Notice of Your Right to Appeal the Assessment. Please read this and if you have questions feel free to contact me for further explanation.

As a quick update for Landlords, you only have 21 days to report in writing a change in your tenants per Ordinance 32-2015. Please read Section XXI and take steps to comply a form is on the website to aide this change in reporting.


